WHC's 2023 Trail Design Training Course a Success!



The Wisconsin Horse Council along with Recreational Trails Program grant funding, provided by the DNR, sponsored the 15th Trail Design Certification School at Wildcat Mountain State Park. Ten trail supporters attended the four-day class and learned how to correct existing trail problems and create new sustainable trails guided by Mike Riter.

Mike Riter, the owner of Trail Design Specialists, believes in leaving nature's aesthetics intact while simultaneously creating safe, durable, and sustainable horse, mountain bike, hiking, and multi-use trails.




Trail Design Specialists' Trail Master Certification Class covered the latest advances in trail design, construction, and maintenance, focusing on long-term sustainability and ease of care. The course also covered complex topics, including handling user conflicts, correct layout of a trail, avoiding erosion and other environmental issues, proper construction techniques, rehabilitating existing routes, and other topics.



The course included both classroom learning and hands-on practical trail experience.



The class was a mix of DNR staff, county representatives, and volunteers from friends groups from around the state. It created a great dynamic having multiple types of trail workers side by side learning these techniques.





Whether you are a trekker, equestrian, or biker, the benefits of this training will be seen in the trail re-routes and creation for many to enjoy. Volunteers and the DNR working together is the future of sustainable trails.

Wisconsin Horse Council's **Capital Improvement Grant Program Takes Off**

The Wisconsin Horse Council Trails Committee is thrilled to announce the availability of a new Capital Improvement Grant program! The idea to help clubs with larger projects get a jump start came about from long-time friend of the trail community, Karen Kroll. The committee started putting together ideas of what we would like to help fund, and the requirements to receive the funds, before Covid hit. Since that time, we have gotten everything put together, as well as an easy to complete application, and have accumulated enough funds that we can start accepting applications this year!

The basic concept is to help projects that are over \$50,000 projected cost to get the ball rolling on their fundraising goals by granting up to \$10,000 per project. While we have added this opportunity, we will continue with the WHC Trail Grant program as we always have.

To date, the Wisconsin Horse Council has donated almost \$500,000 to clubs, and with the required matching, we have helped make improvements to trails and campgrounds in excess of \$1 Million! We look forward to continuing to helping our friends groups expand the trail system in Wisconsin!

Wisconsin Horse Council Capital Improvement Grant

DESCRIPTION: Promoting and Creating Horse Trails in Wisconsin

- CRIPTION: Promoting and Creating Horse Trails in Wisconsin
 The primary purpose of the Wisconsin Horse Council (WHC) capital improvement grant is to
 provide funding to increase trail access and amenities for equestrians. ADA compliance is
 important to keep in mind as a trail or building enters design or construction phases. WHC
 developed this grant to fund property enhancements, including the building of permanent
 structures. The Capital Improvement Grant program is not an annual grant, but one that allows
 the WHC Trails Committee to recognize and support larger projects that will be of benefit to the
 equestrian community. The Capital Improvement Grant is a 50% matching grant. WHC encourages volunteerism and effectively turns volunteer time and effort into project funds, when a log of volunteer's names and donated hours are maintained and submitted with the Grant Completion Report. This means that the 50% of matching funds (approximately 175 hours) may be achieved in volunteer time. Volunteer hours are valued at \$29.00/hour.
- WHC Trails Committee accepts and reviews applications throughout the year. Grant
 application acceptance or denial is determined within three months of receipt. Approved grant
 projects requiring multiyear fundraising will receive a pledge of funding. Funds are mailed
 when work on the project begins.
- To be eligible for the Capital Improvement Grant, projects must be projected to cost over \$50,000. Grant funding is available up to \$10,000.

Eligibility requirements:

Organizations applying for the grant must be a current level II or III member of Wisconsin

Applicants must also be one of the following: a public charity with approved 501(c)(3) exempt status, a federal, state, or local governmental agency, an American Indian nation or tribal community. Individuals, businesses, and private foundations are NOT eligible to apply for the grant.

Projects must support sustainable equestrian trails in Wisconsin that are open to the public.

Funding can only be used for the project referenced in the approved grant application

within the timeframe stated on the grant application

WHC will only consider project expenses incurred after grant application approval

WHC capital grant is only awarded to a property or organization once. Project expense may include but are not limited to the following:

ollowing: Bathrooms Well Water Campgrounds Exploratory Surveying Trailhead New Trails Shelter

What to include with the WHC Capital Improvement Grant Application:

If the property has a master plan, it must reference the proposed project. Include a copy of the relevant pages of the master plan.

Approval from the land manager or government agency confirming support for the project and the organization proposing the project.

A copy of a map indicating the proposed trail or project with a clear description and location of the property and project.

Include copies of written bids for materials, supplies, labor, and equipment to be used to complete the project.

Photographs of the area referenced in the grant application.



Fundraising Fun at Governor Dodge State Park



On Sunday, June 4, more than 120 participants and volunteers gathered at Governor Dodge State Park to take part in the Friends of Governor Dodge Equestrian committee's "Find the Magic" fundraiser. Blue skies and sunshine invited scavenger hunters on horse-back or on foot to set out in search of 10 "magical creatures" placed at intervals along a marked trail in the park. A prize drawing, professional photographer portraits, 50/50 raffle, line dancing demo and lessons by the Driftless Dancers, a pop-up tack sale and a great walking taco lunch catered by a dedicated mother-daughter volunteer team awaited treasure hunters upon their return to the Twin Valley picnic shelter starting point.

Proceeds from this fun event will go to funding a picnic shelter in the park's equestrian campground which opened in 2022. The shelter will be located next to the Driftless perimeter trail and will provide a shady rest stop for hikers and horseback riders enjoying the trail's 15-plus miles of beautiful and varied scenery, as well as for equestrian campers. With the generous support of many sponsors including the Wisconsin Horse Council, prize donors, and participants, the event generated over \$11,000 for the picnic shelter project, which is planned for construction later in the fall of this year. Dear Horse Council,

On behalf of the Wisconsin Quarter Horse Association, I would like to thank you for the grant given to the WQHA for our Spring Tune Up Clinic in April. The weather was a bit on the cold side, and we had a few people cancel, but we still had 40 people who took advantage of the opportunity to learn from some nationally known and respected clinicians.

We used the grant money to pay for the clinicians' and demo riders' motel rooms. The clinicians donated all of their time, gas and/or flight costs, so paying for their rooms was a small "thank you."

The association netted about \$500.00 after all expenses were paid, so the grant made the difference between breaking even and putting a little money in the treasury. 



Suggestions for Approaching a Horse Safely

- Speak to the horse in a normal tone of voice to identify yourself as a human.
- Make yourself visible.
- Keep calm and avoid sudden movements which could startle a horse.
- Allow the horse to be on the uphill side of you and the trail where it may feel safer.
- Be alert for instructions from the equestrian. Each horse is different and has its own personality. What spooks one horse may be "old hat" to another.

When Approaching a Horse

The most critical moment is when you approach the horse. When approaching from the front, stop and check with the rider. If necessary, step off the trail on the downhill side to allow the horse to pass. The equestrian will often have the best suggestion about how to pass the horse. When overtaking from behind, call out to the rider and the horse when you think they can hear you. Continue calling until you get a response.

Use caution when passing horses. Allow as much room as possible to avoid being kirked or spooking the horse. Proceed slowly and steadily while passing, continuing to talk to the rider. If an equestrian gives you the right of way, wait until the rider gives you the signal that it is safe for you to pass.

General Guidelines

- Downhill traffic yields to uphill traffic.
- Keep right, pass left.
- Stay on designated trails.
- Avoid muddy trails.
- Respect private property.
- Never ride alone. If you must do so, tell someone where you plan to go and when you think you will be back.
- Maintain a safe distance between riders
- Leave gates as you find them.
- Carry out your trash and that of others.
- Volunteer for trail building and maintenance projects.
- Join a trail advocacy group. There is strength in numbers.
- Let the appropriate land manager know about any concerns you may have about the trail.
- Share your appreciation about good trail experiences as well.

Our goal is to help us all be good trail citizens together. It is in our mutual best interests to work together for successful multi use trails. Be aware of the needs of other users on the trails.

Be courteous, be safe, and have fun!



Sharing Trails Safely with Horses



Trails on public lands are among Wisconsin's greatest assets. Population growth and new technologies mean that trails historically used by hikers and equestrians now support diverse enthusiasts.

A positive trail experience requires cooperation, understanding and courtesy by all trail users. The principles outlined here are intended to help you make informed decisions on how to share the trails safely with horses.

Bicyclist

Bicyclists may not realize that bicycles are swift, silent and low to the ground in ways that resemble natural predators to a horse. Thus, they can trigger a flight response in a horse that may override even years of excellent training.

For safety reasons, bicyclists should yield to horses and foot traffic (hikers.)

approaching horses from any direction, make verbal contact by speaking calmly. Pass only when a rider has told you



Stop your bike and do not advance until you get a definite signal from the equestrian.

If the right of way is yielded to you, pass slowly and cautiously. Resume speed only when you have passed safely.

It is your responsibility to be in control. Do not let your brakes cause skidding, as the sudden noise

and dust may frighten a horse

Hikers can help calm a spooking horse by slowly removing your backpack, since the pack may diaguise the fact that you are a person. Remain in sight of the horse, if you step off the trail out of sight, horses may see it as a predatory move and become apprehensive about passing you. When you encounter a horse, speak to the rider as soon as practical.

If you are hiking with children, horses can be both interesting and scary. Check with the equestrian before approaching a horse. Ask permission for your child to get the horse; most equestrians will be happy to oblige.

Off-Highway Vehicles

Off-Highway Vehicle operators must be alert to slower traffic, and need to understand that the sound and vibrations of your vehicles can scare horses. It may be best to shut off your engine if horses are spooking, and let horses pass. Having the engine off also makes it easier to communicate with other trail users.

Because they travel at higher speed, OHV's may require greater stopping distance than others on the trail. Drivers should slow down around bind corners and anticipate the presence of other trail users.

While your engine is running, be especially alert visually to compensate for your limited hearing ability.

OHV operators may find that removing your helmet helps calm horses by showing the horse that you are just a human in there.

Equestrians

Equestrians need to let others know if special care is needed to pass your horse safely. Slow to a walk when approaching other trail users, including other equestrians. Start a conversation as soon as possible.

It may be advisable for you to find a place to get off the trail, facing oncoming traffic. Horses tend to feel safer on the high side of the trail. Although horses have the right of way, a horse leaving the trail briefly may have less impact on the terrain than another type of user doing so.

Take responsibility for your horse's training. Expose your horse to a variety of situations to desensitize it to potential threats before you encounter them on the trail.

Responsibility

Education is Everyone's

Each user group needs to share responsibility for educating and monitoring its own members. Be aware of conditions. It is your responsibility as a trail user to know the rules of the trail and apply them with courtesy. Speak up when you see someone who does not know the rules.

Regulations may vary among land management agencies. Check at the trailhead before heading out, or call the agency for clarification if you have any questions.


