The sleighs of all styles were pulled by equines and paraded at 11:30 a.m. past the crowd of people to impress everyone to





vote for their favorite in each category. Prize buckets were donated by Steers Tack and filled with donations

### Finding the Magic at Governor Dodge State Park



On Sunday, June 4th, the equestrian trails at Governor Dodge State Park will be the scene of lots of fun surprises when the Friends equestrian committee hosts a scavenger hunt fundraiser ride/hike with the theme "Find the Magic." Horseback riders and hikers will seek magical creatures of many varieties along a designated route, turning in their completed lists for a chance at prizes. The event will be held during the DNR "free fun weekend" when vehicle sticker and trail pass requirements are waived, making it a



great time to get out and enjoy camaraderie with friends while exploring the always beautiful scenery of Governor Dodge State Park. Fundraiser participants will receive a very special tee shirt with an "enchanting" custom-designed logo. With a raffle and lunch option available, the Friends equestrian committee believes this event will continue the tradition of keeping the "fun" in fundraising!



Event proceeds will be used to "Raise the Roof" on an open-air picnic shelter in the group gathering area of the equestrian campground that opened in 2022. The gathering area currently has a beautiful masonry fire ring surrounded by a concrete patio inlaid with personalized bricks from over 120 individuals and



groups who have donated \$1,000 or more toward the campground project. The planned picnic shelter will offer

campers, riders, and hikers on the adjoining Driftless trail a place to gather or take a break in all types of weather. A plan has been selected and approved by the park, and the Friends have obtained preliminary bids for the shelter kit, construction costs, site prep, electrical, and restoration. The target date for project completion is the summer of 2023, pending grant funding and fundraising progress.



Event registrations are now open, and the Friends are also seeking sponsors at the \$500 and \$100 levels.

The Wisconsin Horse Council sells this important notice in two sizes, 11" x 16" and 16" x 26". Both sizes are printed on heavy gauge plastic in order to help resist fading and to stay strong.

You can also complete and mail in a WHC Product Order Form, (which is available as a printable PDF on the WHC website), with the appropriate fees. #### **Description:**

Level I membership class is available to any individual/family whose interests are similar to those of the Council and is for individuals/families only. Level I and Level II members elect Directors to the WHC Board to represent their District. Family membership is for a family of 2 or more living at the same residence and has 1 vote in the elections and business of their District. Membership must be current to vote at District meetings.

- Programs such as the Certified Judges and Ride Wisconsin require a Level I membership even if you are a Director or a contact person for a Level II or III organization, you will need to be a Level I member yourself to participate in programs.
- Youth (17 & under) are free with a paid Level I adult membership.

LIFETIME MEMBERSHIP is an individual Level I membership with a one-time fee, giving the individual a paid-up membership for his/her lifetime. If LIFETIME MEMBERS wish to retain the \$1 Million personal liability insurance after their first year, they must purchase it on an annual basis. The printed newsletter is included with this membership annually at no additional cost.

Wisconsin Horse Council does not sell or distribute our membership list. Information is kept private for use only by our organization for WHC business.

Membership dues, payments and gifts to Wisconsin Horse Council are not deductible as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes. Such payments may be deductible under the Internal Revenue Code as ordinary and necessary business expenses.
