DEAN JOHANNINGMEIER WHC Honorary Lifetime Member 2023



Farrier, Dean Johanningmeier, started trimming hooves when he was 13, at his family's home in lowa. He became a full-time farrier in 1970 and in 1985 became the farrier for the University of Wisconsin Veterinary Medicine School.

Dean is one of three Wisconsin farriers who have been nominated and accepted into the International Farriers Hall of Fame.

Dean is certified in Equine Lameness and Natural Balance Trimming and Shoeing. His philosophy is what he does affects the whole horse.

What stands out about Dean Johanningmeier is his strong beliefs in education and mentoring. When he was starting out, he made frequent trips to Elkador, Iowa to learn from Vernell

Thiese. He in turn had a standing offer for young horse shoers to watch him when he was working at the UW Vet School.

In a post by Jeremy McGovern, "Therapeutic Shoeing", McGovern stated that Dean Johanningmeier has two passions in foot care; therapeutic work and passing on what he's learned.

Even though Dean is now "retired", as late as last fall when I spoke to him; he was in the midst of preparing a clinic for farriers. Throughout his career he has gone to great lengths to not only educate and mentor farriers and shoers, but to educate UW Vet School students, and just as importantly, horse owners.



RAY ANTONIEWICZ WHC Honorary Lifetime Member 2023

Ray Antoniewicz should be known as the "Father of the 4-H Horse Project." Serving as an Extension Specialist from 1967 to 1998, Ray organized the first State 4-H Horse Show in 1969 and initiated the Wisconsin 4-H Horse Association in 1971. This was just the beginning. The project and its curriculum grew by leaps and bounds.

Ray encouraged volunteer leader training and in 1980 organized the first 4-H Horse Project Leader Conference at Upham Woods. Workshops included a mixture of horse related and leadership development topics for adult and youth leaders. This remains an annual event today, sometimes with over 200 in attendance.



Antoniewicz worked to expand learning

opportunities for youth beyond the state borders. He served on the planning committee for the Eastern National 4-H Roundup. Working with other State Extension Specialists, he served on committees to develop Horse Bowl materials, criteria for public speaking events, horse judging and Hippology.

Ray served as an author of the National 4-H Horse Project curriculum and did a major update after his retirement. Ray's emphasis was to strengthen and broaden the project and help more youth find ways to develop their life skills through their interest in horses.

Ray summarized his feelings about 4-H by stating, "4-H is a great way of developing youth in so many aspects of personal growth and especially their skills and abilities to work with groups and individuals. The time we spent in the project wasn't about training horses, but rather developing young people."

DEAN MEYER, DVM WHC Honorary Lifetime Member 2023

Dr. Dean Meyer began his veterinary career at Lodi Veterinary Care in 1969, after receiving his BS and DVM degree from Michigan State University. He later owned and operated Riverdale Veterinary Clinic in Muscoda, WI and in 1984 he established Madison Equine Clinic. In 2007, a decision was made to merge Madison Equine Clinic with Lodi Veterinary Care, bringing his career full circle. Dr. Meyer has been involved

with horses and their owners on many different levels during his career. He helped establish the Wisconsin State Horse Council and was their first President. He is also a member of the American Veterinary Medical Association, the Wisconsin Veterinary Medical Association and the American Association of Equine Practitioners. Dr. Meyer's interest in equine nutrition led to the formation of Doctor's Choice Supplements, the makers of Equi-Shine. His other professional interests include reproduction, lameness, and all aspects of dental care. Dr. Meyer also enjoys raising and showing Morgan horses with his wife, Wendy, and daughter, Nicole.

Have you posted limited liability signs on your property or at your equine events with Wisconsin State Statute 895.481 (1) (e) printed on them?

The Wisconsin Horse Council sells this important notice in two sizes, 11" x 16" and 16" x 26". Both sizes are printed on heavy gauge plastic in order to help resist fading and to stay strong.

There are several ways that you can purchase these signs. 



Molasses Balls Horse Treat Recipe

1/2 cup Molasses 1-1/2 cup Oats 1/4 cup Water 1 cup Sweet Feed

3/4 Cup Whole Wheat Flour

Pour molasses and water into pot. Stir continuously over medium heat until it starts to bubble but not boil. After it bubbles, turn the heat on low. Stir in all of the flour before stirring in the oats. Remove from the heat and quickly stir in the sweet feed. It should be the consistency of cookie dough. Place on a non-stick cookie sheet or waxed paper. Let cool and roll into balls.

*Please check with your veterinarian if your horse has any dietary restrictions prior to feeding these treats.

SHARING THE ROADS

Laws to Live By - brought to you by Anne Murphy, WHC V.P.



Most people have come to associate this phrase, sharing the roads with motorcycles. Vehicle drivers also need to share the roads with people riding or driving horses. There are two important sections of Wisconsin State Statutes Chapter 346 that apply to horses on roadways.

Under Wisconsin State Statute 346.02 "....Every person riding an animal or driving any animal drawn vehicle...upon a roadway is granted all the rights and is subject to all the duties which this chapter grants or applies to the operator of a vehicle, except those provisions of this chapter which by

their very nature would have no application."

The second pertinent section of this chapter is WI SS 346.11 "Whenever a person riding, driving or leading an animal which is frightened, gives a signal of distress to the operator of a motor vehicle by a raising of a hand or otherwise, the operator of the motor vehicle shall promptly stop his (or her) vehicle unless a movement forward is necessary to avoid an accident or injury and shall, upon request, stop all motive power until such animal is under control."

Since vehicles are quieter and drivers are more distracted than ever, riders and animal handlers need to be proactive when it comes to safety. Helmets are incredibly important; I strongly urge riders to always use them. Reflective vests and reflective material attached to tack are also excellent additions to your gear.

My interpretation of the duties of the rider or handler is to travel the same as traffic as opposed to riding facing traffic. However, putting safety first, I opt to travel on whichever side of the roadway has wider shoulders should you need safe space to handle a nervous horse or horse that is acting up. Many of the smaller roadways have narrow and or deep ditches that pose a potential safety hazard.

Travel as close to the shoulder of the road as possible, not in the middle of the traffic lane. Be aware of hills and the potential dangers of vehicles cresting the hill frequently in the middle of the road.

Be aware of what your horses are telling you, check behind you frequently. Some vehicles are incredibly quiet these days and there are always chance encounters with bicycles that seem to sneak up from behind. If you and your horse are both experienced and calm, you can wave drivers to pass you.

Above all, keep calm. Your horse is looking to you for leadership. If you get nervous, your horse will too. Sometimes it will take an Oscar worthy performance, but you can do it.

Of course, no article about roadway safety would be complete without a comment on cell phones. I do encourage carrying a cell phone when riding, on your person, not in your saddle bags! Nothing is more annoying than an unplanned meeting with the ground and watching your horse leave with your phone. I do discourage using your cell phone while riding, especially on roadways. If you feel a need to use your phone, find a safe space and take a break to make that call or answer that text.

If you have a young horse or a horse that tends to be nervous, ride with another friend/horse team that are comfortable on roadways and being around traffic.

Be courteous, if a driver passes cautiously, I like to acknowledge that with a friendly wave and a smile.

Some of these things you can practice at home before venturing out on a road. Ride your horse around your vehicle or recruit family or friends to help your horse become accustomed to vehicles and bicycles. Have someone beep their horn while you are near the vehicle. Go slowly with this type of training, some horses acclimate more quickly than others. Always try to end on a positive note.

There isn't anything in this chapter of the Wisconsin statutes providing for cleaning up after your horse. If you travel through a community or subdivision and aren't certain if there are any local ordinances pertaining to this, take the initiative and clean up. I keep plastic bags and a cat litter scoop in my saddle bag.

Motor vehicle drivers need to slow down and approach cautiously, give as much space while passing as possible. Please do NOT beep your horn. Hopefully the rider is aware of your presence. Horses can make incredibly fast movements onto roadways, so you really need to be aware and prepared to stop.

There are no winners in crashes. Safety is imperative for everyone on our roadways!






