#### Local Equestrian Group Improves Horseriders' Campground

On a hot summer day in August, the Southern Kettle Horse Trail Association (SKMHTA) gathered a team of hard working volunteers to install new corrals on campsites in the Kettle Moraine State Forest - Southern Unit's equestrian campground, located in Palmyra, Wisconsin.

Fundraising events, sponsorships from local businesses, private donations and a large grant from the Wisconsin Horse Council allowed the club to upgrade six additional campsites. The newly installed corrals are constructed of



Priefert Premium 12 foot panels, which have proven to be a safe and sturdy equine containment system. While traditional equestrian campsites have hitching rails or high line posts to tether animals, campers often prefer the option of a corral.



Many riders who have never camped before have felt confident enough to camp for the first time due to a secure corral waiting at their campsite! As Palmyra and Eagle offer many horse-friendly local businesses, Horseriders' Campground is a favorite among the community, allowing visitors to ride their horse, mule or donkey to get an ice cream cone, cold drink, or hot meal. Local trail hosts, such as Wild 3L Ranch, even offer this experience to those who do not own their own horse!

#### Friends "Raise the Roof" at Governor Dodge State Park



In October, a beautiful new 20'x36' picnic shelter was erected along the multi-use Driftless trail at Governor Dodge State Park, forming part of the group gathering area at the equestrian campground. The shelter offers a great place for riders and hikers to take a break when enjoying the park's extensive Driftless perimeter trail and provides a shady and dry space for campers at the equestrian campground to gather. The \$55,000-plus project was funded by the Friends of

Governor Dodge State Park after several years of seeking donations, holding fundraiser trail rides and selling trail passes. The Friends are grateful to the Wisconsin Horse Council Trail Committee for their event sponsorships and the \$3,000 grant that helped fund this great trailside amenity.

In late September the shelter materials kit, purchased from Cedar Forest Products in Michigan, arrived at the park in pieces on a flatbed truck. Under the capable leadership of project manager Duane



Deutmeyer (Pine Hill LLC) volunteers donated 70 hours of time to tasks including staining boards, columns and roofing trusses, and assisting with carpentry. The shelter is part of an accessible group gathering area at the equestrian campground, next to a large fire ring and concrete patio where bricks are displayed



recognizing the many "Extraordinary Friends" who donated \$1,000 or more to the campground project. A permanent display recognizing the generosity of campground major donors including the Wisconsin State Horse Council Equine Foundation and the estate

of Iris Cooley, and the Wisconsin Horse Council Trail Committee is in the design phase and should be in place sometime in 2024.

#### ANNUAL AWARD NOMINATIONS NOW OPEN

These Awards are sponsored by the Wisconsin Horse Council, Inc. in cooperation with the Midwest Horse Fair®. Nominations may be submitted by clubs, associations, or individuals.

Horseperson of The Year Award is based on contributions to Wisconsin's equine industry as a whole, or in any specific area such as: youth activities, education, research, industry promotion, related legislation and regulation, trails, other equine events, or activities.

- Any person 18 years old or older can be nominated.
- Nominees must be a Wisconsin resident.
- Nominees need not be a member of the WHC.
- Include a paragraph explaining why your nominee should receive this award. Nominations received without an appropriate write up will not be accepted.

Special Achievement Award is based on a major accomplishment in the equine industry.

- Any person 18 years old or older can be nominated.
- Nominees must be a Wisconsin resident.
- Nominees need not be a member of the WHC.
- Include a paragraph explaining why your nominee should receive this award. Nominations received without an appropriate write up will not be accepted.

Lifetime Achievement Award is based on a lifetime of service to the equine industry.

- Preference given to any person who has devoted at least 25 years to the equine industry.
- Nominees must be a Wisconsin resident.
- Nominees need not be a member of the WHC.
- Include a paragraph explaining why your nominee should receive this award. Nominations received without an appropriate write up will not be accepted.

Show Judge of the Year is based on the integrity, diversity of knowledge, sportsmanship, willingness to accept and continually strive for greater knowledge of various breeds and disciplines at open shows.

**Equine of the Year** is to recognize the horses, ponies, donkeys, mules or any equine who have enriched the life of one or more humans or been cast into the spotlight because of outstanding acts, creating a positive image for equines and is awarded to the owner of the horse and is based on merit and voted on by the WHC Board of Directors which will decide the state Equine of the Year.

- Nominated equine must be a living resident of Wisconsin.
- Owner must be a resident of Wisconsin
- A completed WHC Equine of the Year Award Nomination Form, one (1) clear, color photo of the nominated equine (5x7 or 8x10), and an essay containing 250 words or less describing how the nominated equine has enriched the life of one or more people through outstanding training, contributions or accomplishments or been cast into the spotlight because of outstanding acts, creating a positive image for equines must be received on or before December 1, 2023.

Awards will be presented to the winners at the Wisconsin Horse Council Awards Ceremony on Sunday, April 21, 2024 during the Midwest Horse Fair®.

#### **Equestrian Trails at Hartman's Creek State Park**



It had been a very warm summer last year, but with that said, things were still happening on the horse trails that summer. Saddle Bags equine group was busy with trail maintenance and improvements

Last summer, with the help of a grant from the Wisconsin Horse Council and group volunteers, we were able to put in a manure pit at the horse trailhead/parking lot. It took 27 hours of volunteer work, but it looks great and is a big help in keeping the parking lot clean. With the installation of the pit, forks and wheelbarrows were purchased for the convenience of riders to use to pick up behind their horses in the parking lot. With money from that grant, there were three new very sturdy mounting blocks built, which will be placed at various places on the trails where it may be necessary for someone to dismount/mount their horse. There

were 51 hours of volunteer work put in on those. There were three trail clean-up days scheduled and performed as well.

But last summer wasn't all work, despite the warm weather, riders were out enjoying the trails. Saddle Bags had two rides scheduled per month as a standard, and we frequently contacted each other to meet at the park for non-scheduled rides. There were many non-Saddle Bags riders out enjoying the trails, and hikers too. Hartman's Creek doesn't allow bikers on the horse trails, but hikers are welcome. Hikers please remember horses are a prey animal, so their first response to meeting something they aren't sure of is to run away. When meeting a horse and rider on the trail, stand still and talk so the horse knows you aren't something they need to be afraid of. This will help keep everyone safe. If you want to pet their horse please ask the rider for permission first. They will let you know if their horse is okay with that.



We then welcomed Fall...the best season trail riding has to offer! Happy trails!

#### Remembering Bob Michaels: A Trailblazer, Craftsman, and Friend



The Southern Kettle Moraine lost one of the good guys this past September. Bob's impact on the equestrian community and trail system in southeastern Wisconsin has left an indelible mark, touching the hearts of those who had the privilege of working alongside him.

Bob was a fixture in the Southern Kettle Moraine Horse Trail Association (SKMHTA). His contributions spanned over fifteen years. Many first encountered Bob and his wife

Margaret at SKMHTA meetings or events, where he quickly became known for his meticulous craftsmanship and unwavering commitment to enhancing the horse trail experience.

Trail coordinator - Bob's accomplishments as trail coordinator include organizing trail cleanups, hitching post installation and maintenance, and most notably overseeing the installation of electrical to the campsites at Horseriders' Campground in Palmyra, WI. He also built the kiosk at the entrance to the campground. In addition, Bob and Margaret were instrumental in installing trail markers and posts along the 33 miles of horse trails and 55 miles of loop trails.



Anne Korman, Property Supervisor of the Southern Kettle Moraine Forest, commented that conversations about SKMHTA projects with Bob and Margaret were always productive. She remembers Bob's "kind smile and easy-going personality." Anne recalled Bob's willingness to clear downed trees on the trails and fix whatever needed repair.

Bob was generous with his talents. Many people commented on his welcoming demeanor when involving others on projects. Don Dane, WI DNR Parks and Recreation Specialist, commented on how Bob would ask permission to complete various projects and the confidence that everyone had in Bob that the project would be done right. Bob was competent, well-rounded and knowledgeable. He attended trail school as well as chain saw safety classes. He was very safety conscious.



Hammered Horse, LLC - Bob's talents extended beyond trail work. His creations, such as unique hoof picks, saddle stands, and other horse related handmade products were very popular. He sold these items worldwide through his company, Hammered Horse, LLC. He specialized in products made of wood, leather, and metal. Bob often had a booth at the Midwest Horse Fair. He donated items for fundraisers and supported various causes, leaving a lasting impact on the wider equestrian community.



As we bid farewell to Bob Michaels, we celebrate a life well-lived and a legacy that will endure through the trails he helped shape, the people he touched, and the memories he created. Happy Trails, Bob. Your dedication, kindness, and craftsmanship will be cherished forever.

He was such a friendly, good -natured guy; you couldn't help but listen to every word he had to say. He offered common sense solutions to any kind of problem that came up. It seemed like he could figure out anything! Bob not only donated his time and talent to SKMHTA, but he also generously supported other worthy causes, like the Hags on Nags Saddle Club 'Pink Ribbon Ride' to benefit breast cancer research and treatment. In 2019 a newly formed group began fundraising to build a brand-new equestrian campground at Governor Dodge State Park. Bob was one of the friendliest, most supportive and encouraging people I have ever met! No matter what your age or appearance, he was right there telling you "you can do it!" I remember working side by side with Bob over the years, but what really sticks out is his enthusiasm for pushing yourself to learn new things. He motivated me to attend the Trail Building School a few years back, and this spring we attended the Chainsaw Safety course together! 

#### Description

The Sponsorship Committee of Wisconsin Horse Council (WHC) looks for ways to promote the use and enjoyment of horses and ideas to educate horse people and the public at large - particularly youth. We welcome ideas for activities that allow people to interact with equines of all kinds. Maximum amount that could be approved for any one project or event is \$5,000. For requests more than \$5,000, the application has to go to our Board of Directors through the WHC President.

#### **Requirements**

- 1. Organizations applying for a WHC Sponsorship MUST BE A CURRENT MEMBER OF WHC.
- 2. Be sure to include an estimated budget for your project or event.
- 3. Include as much pertinent information with your application as possible.
- 4. It is also required that you submit a completion report due within a year of receiving your funds Which includes:
  - A financial statement of how sponsorship funding was spent (copies of receipts where applicable)
  - A copy, picture or link that shows WHC recognition for help with funding.
  - Pictures of completed projects (where applicable) See page 3 for an example of required information
- 5. If your sponsorship is approved, it is required the WHC be recognized as a contributor to your event or project.
  - For example –social media/web site recognition, hang a banner at your function, a sponsorship plaque, an article in the WHC newsletter, and if applicable have WHC mentioned during the announcements or in promotional materials.

A representative(s) from your organization may be asked to attend a WHC meeting to give a short presentation regarding the project or event that received funding.

If it is not possible to complete the project within the sponsorship year, you should prepare an interim report describing the components of the project completed to date and the expected completion date. A final report is required at the completion of the project.

#### \*Those with previous incomplete sponsorships (including completion reports) will not be eligible for more funding until the obligation is met.

#### **Application Deadline**

Sponsorship applications MUST BE POSTMARKED BY February 28 or September 30. An organization may receive only one sponsorship per calendar year.


