We are excited to share highlights of the event we hosted on October 6, 2024, at Somers Lake Recreational Area, in northern Polk County, Wisconsin. Our event "Somers Lake Recreational Area Open House & Equestrian Play Day" was well attended by several area




horse people, who enjoyed a beautiful day on the trails

and trying out the new equestrian obstacle course designed and built by both WHC District 1 Officers and the NW Wisconsin Equestrian Friends. The day included a



guided ride in the morning, hotdogs on the grill, visiting with friends, and was followed by another ride in the afternoon.

Somers Lake Recreational Area, although open to several user groups, has been very underutilized and few horse people even knew it was open for equestrian use or had even heard about Somers Lake! When our groups realized what a beautiful and



fun place this was to ride, we knew this was a worthwhile project. After consulting with Polk County Parks & Trails, we got the go ahead to do some trail maintenance and even add on to the existing trails! Although quite beautiful, fun and challenging



to ride, with hills and valleys, Somers Lake has only a little more than two miles of groomed trails. We decided that adding an equestrian obstacle course would be perfect to create a unique and interesting asset to attract riders and encourage more trail use. Somers Lake will continue to be a work in progress as we are making plans to update the area map, add all new signs, create new trails through the forest, and also additional obstacles to the course.



#### **New Prospect Horse Riders Campground Receives Donated Fire Rings**

New Prospect, Wisconsin - September 25, 2024 – The New Prospect Horse Riders' Campground in the Kettle Moraine State Forest-North has received a generous donation of 22 new fire rings from the Northern Kettle Moraine Horse Trail Association and the Wisconsin Horse Council. These fire rings will enhance the camping experience for visitors and provide a gathering place for horse riders and their families.

The donated fire rings were installed at every family campsite within the campground, allowing campers to enjoy cozy evenings by the fire. These new amenities will not only improve the overall camping experience but also contribute to the campground's appeal as a popular destination for horse riders and outdoor enthusiasts.

"We are incredibly grateful for the donation of these fire rings from the Northern Kettle Moraine Horse Trail Association and the Wisconsin Horse Council," said Joe Giesfeldt, Assistant Superintendent, at Wisconsin DNR.

"These fire rings will provide a valuable addition to our campground and enhance the enjoyment of our visitors."

The Northern Kettle Moraine Horse Trail Association and the Wisconsin Horse Council have a long history of supporting equestrian activities and promoting the preservation of horse trails in the Kettle Moraine State Forest. This donation is a testament to their commitment to providing exceptional facilities for horse riders and their families.

About the New Prospect Horse Riders Campground: The New Prospect Horseriders' Campground has 22 family campsites with 20/30/50-amp electric service and three group sites. Each family campsite has a picnic table, fire ring and a 30x30-foot graveled area with high-line hitching posts and corrals for horses.

The campground is centrally located in the state forest and provides easy access to the 33-mile bridle trail which traverses the length of the forest. There also are two loop trails, the 2.5-mile Crooked Lake Loop and the 4-mile Forest Lake Loop. All horse riders 16 years and older must have a state trail pass while using the designated bridle trails in the state forest. The campground opens the first weekend in May and closes the last weekend in October.

About the Northern Kettle Moraine Horse Trail Association and the Wisconsin Horse Council: The Northern Kettle Moraine Horse Trail Association (NKMHTA) was established in September, 2003 to provide area equestrians an opportunity to make an impact working with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources preserving, improving, and developing equestrian facilities in the Northern Kettle Moraine State Forest.

The Wisconsin State Horse Council (WHC) is here for "the horse" and the people who own them or simply love them. We exist solely for the welfare of the horse and the betterment of our industry as a whole.

#### **Moving Mountains at Governor Dodge State Park**

Thanks to the efforts of the Friends group, multiple sections of Governor Dodge State Park's 25 miles of multi-use trails will undergo repairs this fall. The picture shows a small part of the 261 tons of breaker rock and gravel recently purchased by the Friends and delivered by Rule Construction of Dodgeville. Soon, park maintenance staff will begin grading and strategically placing breaker rock and gravel to stabilize steep trail sections where years of torrential rains have led to significant erosion. Low-lying and chronically muddy areas will have

material added to improve footing for both two and four-legged trail users.

Improving trail conditions is a particular goal for the Friends in 2024. The group's equestrian committee held a fundraising ride and hike In June with the proceeds designated for trail maintenance and improvements. Thanks to many generous sponsors and participants, including the Wisconsin Horse Council, and dedicated volunteers giving many hours of their time, the event raised just over \$6,000. The Friends were also awarded a State of Wisconsin 2024 Heritage Trust grant of \$3,000 for facilities and trail maintenance, bringing the project budget to \$9,000. Funds will be used to pay for machine and operator hours in addition to materials.

The Friends, led by Vice President Chip Forrest, have also undertaken the replacement of 20 steps on the park's scenic Pine Cliff Nature Trail. A \$1,000 Natural Resource Foundation Quiet Trails grant paid for timbers and other materials for this project, and outside groups have assisted in the highly labor- intensive process of removing old, rotted timbers, setting new ones, and backfilling with gravel. The Pine Cliff trail is a hiking-only trail that traverses Governor Dodge State Park's designated Natural Area, showcasing typical Driftless area topographic and plant features. Horse riders are encouraged to leave their mounts in camp and head over to the Pine Cliff Trailhead near the Enee Point parking area to explore this lovely park feature.

# SPONSORSHIPS

The Wisconsin Horse Council Sponsorship Committee looks for ways to promote the use and enjoyment of horses and ideas to educate horse people and the public at large—particularly youth.

Maximum amount that could be approved for any one project or event is \$5,000. For requests more than \$5,000, the application will go to our Board of Directors. Funding amounts vary depending on the purpose of the request and how it fits with the WHC Mission statement. WHC Sponsorships offer funding for organizations in need of assistance for a specific use. We encourage fundraising efforts by your organization, as we may match those funds up to a limited amount.

Organizations applying for a sponsorship must be a current WHC Level 2 or Level 3 member. **Sponsorship applications MUST BE POST-MARKED BY February 28 or September 30.** An organization may receive only one sponsorship per calendar year.

Sponsorship money is not provided for normal operating expenses, horse show judges, awards, food, repairs to personal property or may building construction, feed or hay.

Applications are analyzed and their merit assessed based upon the following criteria:

- Educational value
- Horse industry promotion value
  - How many people it will reach

WHC Trails Committee accepts and reviews applications throughout the year. Grant application acceptance or denial is determined within three months of receipt. Approved grant projects requiring multiyear fundraising will receive a pledge of funding. Funds are mailed when work on the project begins.

To be eligible for the Capital Improvement Grant, projects must be projected to cost over \$50,000. Grant funding is available up to \$10,000.

# TRAIL GRANTS

Grants are offered to Wisconsin Horse Council member clubs for work on <u>public</u> trails open to equestrians for riding and/or driving.

Grants are awarded in three distinct categories:

- New trail development
- 2. Existing trail improvements or repairs Maximum amount per grant up to \$3,000 3. Trail enhancements
  - Trail enhancements Maximum amount per grant up to \$2,000

Applications for trail grants must originate with an equestrian organization who is a Level 2 or Level 3 WHC member. An exception to this requirement is for government entities; however, their trail work must benefit equestrian trail riders. Grants are not awarded to individuals.

Applications must be postmarked by February 1st; approved grants will be awarded by May 1. Grants are 50% matching, allowing and value of volunteer labor, donated materials and/or use of equipment, and other monies to count as the 50% matching share from the


No more than two grants per year will be awarded to the same property and each must be used for different trails/projects.

Completion reports of projects are required and must be submitted to the WHC office by December 1 in the same year as grant was received.
